🔧 Eligibility Criteria

€ Financial Support

Funding Coverage:

Grants cover, for example, travel, accommodation, and subsistence costs, up to €2000 per grant.

Reimbursement:

Reimbursement: All expenses will be reimbursed based on actual costs and must comply with COST rules.

✓ How to Apply for an Grant

Follow these steps to apply:

1 Applications need to be **submitted** through **e-COST** via e-services.cost.eu/activity/grants

2 The application will be **assessed** by the Grant Awarding Committee and approved by the Core group.

3 The applicant will be formally notified of the outcome of their application by the Grant Awarding Coordinator within no more than 4 weeks.

4 Successful applicants need to complete and submit a report within 30 days from the end date of the activity, or 15 days after the end of the Grant Period, whichever date comes first.
